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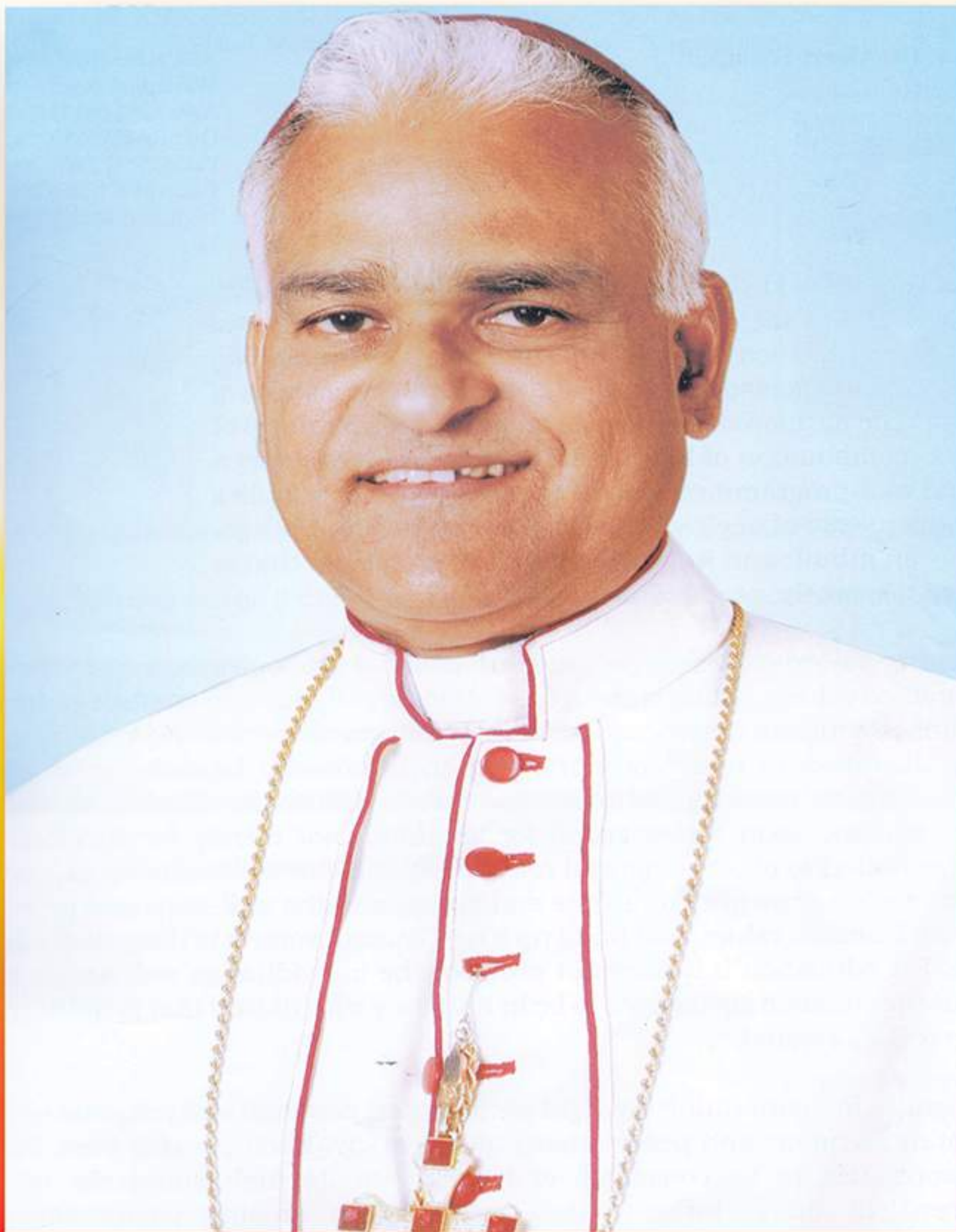

From the Principal's Desk

I am extremely happy to present the Annual Report of the College for the academic year 2017-2018. With the benevolence of God and the co-operation of the staff, the parents and the students we were able to conduct the affairs of the College with a reasonably high degree of success. We were able to maintain high standards, enforce discipline, encourage students to ascend greater heights in academic and co-curricular activities and strike a balance between tradition and innovation.

The College places a lot of importance on studies. The ICSE and the ISC results speak volumes for it. In the ICSE 2017 examination 280 students appeared. Of them 75 got 90% and above. The topper was Harsh Dhar Agarwal with 97.4%. In the ISC, our results were equally good. Of the 155 students that appeared 33 got 90% and above. Tarun Garg was the topper in Commerce stream with 98.75% and Rupak Jain was the topper in the Science Stream with 97.25%.

The College Annual Day was celebrated on May 1, 2017. The students under the guidance of the teachers staged a variety entertainment programme which was appreciated by all. Mr. Surjit Pandey IPS, D.I.G., Agra zone, was the Chief Guest. Special prizes and awards were also given away. The most coveted Archbishop's Gold Medal was won by Pranav Ashra and the Principal's Silver Medal by Tarun Garg.

Going by the dictum 'Teachers are also Learners', the College organized a motivational seminar for the staff. Rev. Fr. George Paul, Archdiocesan Director of Education, was the resource person. The seminar helped the staff to stay updated and cater to the needs of the students in the changing scenario.

In the College parliament election Garvit Kumar was elected Prime Minister; Simar Singh Gulati Cultural Captain; Praveg Vashishtha Deputy PM; Pratik Dhanwani Cabinet Secretary ; Parish Bharadwaj Speaker and Hardik Paliwal, College Captain. Mr. Harvijay Singh Bahia, alumnus and businessman, was the Chief Guest.

A cultural festival, 'Eternia' is organized every year to awaken the dormant talents in the students. The four Houses vied with one another to become the cultural champions of the academic year. Various inter-school competitions were also organized by different clubs. The Commerce Club organized "B-World"; Science cum Computer Fest, Techno-fi, was organized jointly by Science and Computer clubs. The competitions provided ample opportunities to our students to showcase their talents and leadership qualities.

Under the aegis of the Debate Club a host of debates were held which whetted the oratorical skills of our students. The DLA inter-school English Debate for students of Classes XI and XII, DLA inter-school Hindi Debate; Dr. R.G. Bansal memorial inter-school English Debate, and Smt. Saroj Devi Memorial inter-school English debate were held during the year and in all of them our students' performance was highly laudable. Our students also participated in various competitions organized by different institutions in and outside the city.

As is wont, this year also the College attracted a number of important and eminent people who came either as Chief Guests of the functions or just visitors. The Annual Sports Meet was held on November 11, 2017. The standard of performance of various categories of athletes was high which won plaudits from the spectators. The Archbishop Athaide Memorial Football Tournament was also held during the year. Our students took part in various competitions in basketball, cricket, table tennis, football, lawn tennis and chess, organized during the year by various institutions and associations. In all these competitions our students performed well and won many prizes.

We also hosted the ASISC Regional Level lawn tennis tournament in our College on Sept 6 and 7 and the Nationals held on Oct. 8 and 9, 2017. The ASISC UP and UK Regional Level swimming championship was also hosted by us on Sept 16 and 17, 2017.

Special coaching in various games and sports is given to students during the summer holidays.

Class picnics and educational tours were held for the students and the staff to give them opportunities to bond with one another. They are meant to bust stress, and to rejuvenate besides fostering togetherness and camaraderie.

National festivals like Independence day, Republic Day, and national days like Gandhi Jayanti, Martyr's Day were celebrated with traditional fervour and patriotic feeling. These festivals were celebrated in order to inculcate in the students love for their country and respect for national symbols. Festivals like Deepawali, Christmas, Eid, Maharshi Parashuram Jayanti, Valmiki Jayanti, Basant Panchmi and Holi are celebrated in the College to instil in the students respect for different faiths and tolerance for one another. Hindi Divas was also celebrated to instil in the students love for their mother tongue.

Teachers' Day was celebrated with traditional gaiety, with students organizing a cultural programme. The students expressed their gratitude to the teachers for moulding and grooming their lives.

Children's Day was also celebrated in a grand way with a variety of programmes to commemorate the birthday of Jawaharlal Nehru, the first Prime Minister of the nation.

Special classes were held for the students of classes X and XII during the summer vacation. Weak students are given special attention through extra classes after every terminal examinations.

Dr. Neelam Mehrotra, senior teacher of English, retired on October 14th after serving the College for 32 years. She constantly and consistently strove to build the best possible learning opportunities for our students. We wish her health and happiness and many more years of active life.

I am grateful to the Most Rev. Dr. Albert D'Souza, Archbishop of Agra and President of the Governing Body of the College, and the Management Committee for their help and guidance. I also thank the teachers, parents, and ministerial staff for their wholehearted co-operation and selfless devotion. Parenting-In Praise of Praise

One sunny winter afternoon, my husband and I were sitting in the garden with another couple. Their six year old son behaved remarkably well, playing quietly with his toys. Not a word was said to him. Eventually, after at least an hour, the boy came over to us and hit his father on the head with a rolled up newspaper.

"You horrible, naughty boy", shouted his mother. As a teacher and a parent myself, I thought this was unfair. The boy's good behaviour had gone unnoticed, so to gain attention, he resorted, successfully to bad behaviour.

Like many parents, this mother paid attention to her child when he behaved badly, rather than rewarding him when he was good.

Praise is vital to us all. It works much better than criticism or punishment. Without giving children some reward—a hug or a word of praise life can be a bed of thorns.

Along with praise, children need prestige and responsibility. In fact, we all need to feel that we're special, unique, worth something.

All children need help and encouragement in taking responsibility for themselves. Discipline is about being responsible for one's own behaviour and responsive to the need of others.

On Parent Teacher Meeting, I tell the parents—"Praise your child". Children are least bothered about the marks. But surely, they are bothered about the expression on the faces of their parents !!

Praise is a basic human need. Without it, none of us gives of our best. With it, we give of our best, willingly.

"You look fabulous !" "Well Done!", "That meal was marvellous !" Think of the effect these words have on you. Think of the effect a few words of praise, an arm around the shoulder, a hug, have on others, especially young children.

Dear parents ! Children need those words of encouragement, compliments, and appreciation for doing something well. Don't overdo praise, but do praise.

It's no use keeping that appreciation in your heart. Let your thoughts flow into words.

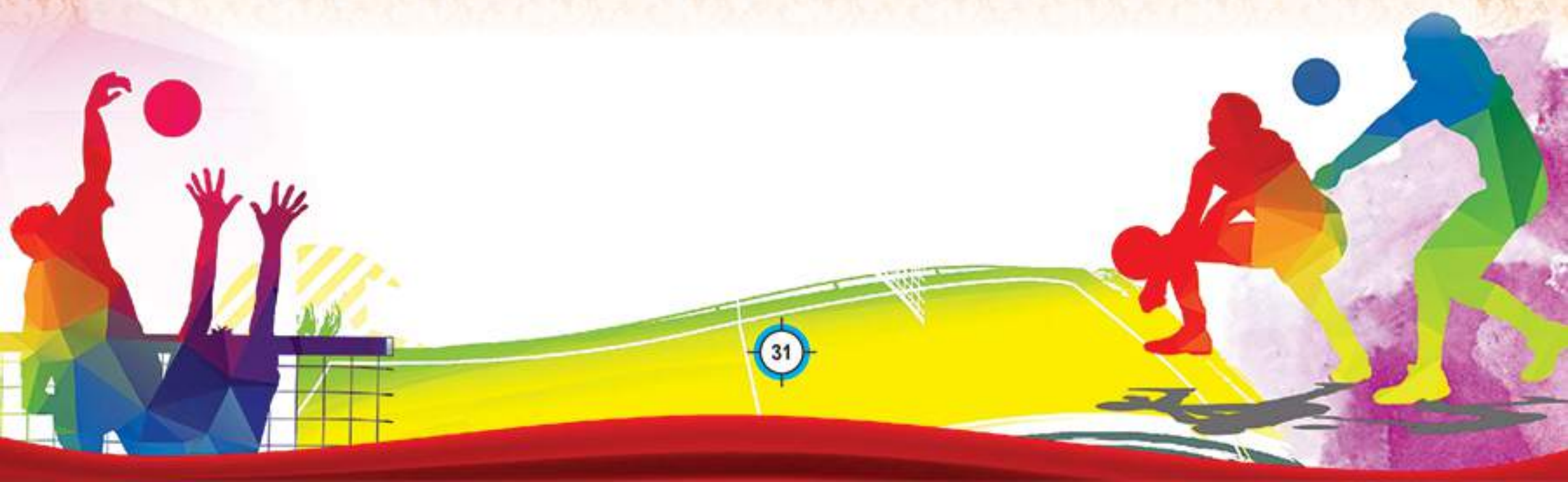

TO BE... NOT TO BE OR LET IT BE



The nightmarish reports in newspapers and the related channel discussions in recent times have put the teaching fraternity in a state of shock, confusion and uncertainty about their fate.

A school Principal was shot dead in her office by a class XI student. Reason : She kept warning the student continuously on his poor performance, and finally informed the parents. Another Principal of a Higher Secondary School in Kerala, a respectable lady who had an illustrious career and was about to retire, committed suicide. Reason : the parents of those students who were caught consuming alcohol in the school campus, stood strongly protecting their wards making allegations and harassing the educator to such an extent that she took the extreme step. The reward for her selfless efforts in moulding future generations for about three decades !

Another teacher in Kerala was put behind bars where he had to undergo the most humiliating and demoralising ordeal for two days. Reason : he had caned some students for their most unacceptable misdeeds in the school premises. Heart broken, the teacher posted a very touching tweet about his stay in jail. He wrote, "The days that taught me that I belong to that category of citizens who has no rights, no duties but only responsibilities."

Very true... we are terrified, confused, shattered and torn to pieces by parents, students, authorities, law makers, human rights activities and countless NGOs. We are concerned not only about our fate but also of our children's. Assaults and shootouts in schools, by frustrated teens, are nothing new in the west. Is this gun/knife wielding culture finding its way into our country?

It is obvious that lack of moral guidance and emotional intelligence are the root causes for such tragic occurrences.

The next question naturally is—who is responsible for inculcating these values in our children? Here starts the blame game, teacher versus parents. In one of the channel debates, I watched how indiscriminately the parents lashed out at teachers and school authorities pointing out the long duration of time the child spends in school compared to that at home. I was aghast at their injudicious accusations. They preferred to forget that it is not quantity (of time) that matters but quality. During these so called long hours the children are not under the love and care of one single teacher, but a number of teachers working according to the set time table to achieve the target, loaded with varied tasks of lecturing, assessing, testing, correcting guiding, training them in different extra-curricular activities, organising events and ofcourse, instilling values whenever and wherever possible.

So, parents spend quality time with your children, sow the seeds of moral values. We, in school can nurture these values in multiple dimensions by exposing them to different life situations as they mingle with children from different cultural and financial backgrounds. We see the reflection of your behaviour in your kids. Beware !! a parent is judged by his or her kids.

Studies reveal that verbal or physical abuse, disrespect for elders, aggression, finding ruthless shortcuts to tasks, selfishness and all such negative tendencies rampant among our youngsters are mostly learnt from their families.

If a teen takes the extreme step of slitting the throat of a nursery kid, his affectionate companion in music class, whom the little one trusted like his elder brother, just to delay a not so important internal examination, it means he was not trained to handle problems in life. Who could put such unbearable mounting pressure on a child to excel in every examination other than the parents ? Who could have taught him to take shortcuts to evade the struggle?

Dear parent, do you remember how you came up with a fake Medical Certificate to allow him to skip an examination that he was not prepared for ? How he was tuned to feel that it's okay to get the photocopies of a friend's notebook to study for the examination rather than being systematic and consistent with the daily schedule of class work and home work ? How you furnished a letter of explanation supported by another Medical Certificate for not attending the Independence Day programme of the school? How can we expect him to grow up into a dutiful citizen?

The same child whom you protected from our scoldings and punitive measures of correction has grown up into a dangerously arrogant, egoistic, self-willed and intolerant teen; a big bully in the school. Are we, the teachers, solely responsible for it?

Next question that arises is—how to deal with such children in school. No doubt : the first suggestion given by all is to punish them.

Let's talk about the punishments that suit them—caning?, No—no, corporal punishment is a crime.

Cutting marks? Never. It will affect their promotion, future and will be a black mark for the school. Getting them out of the class ? Undesirablehe will miss classes.

Suspend from school ? Ridiculous.....he will face depression and frustration and spoil his future.

Summon the parents at once ? Yes, you may come rushing, visibly irritated by the inconvenience caused by our call, taking the side of your ward, arguing and making the teacher concerned the culprit in front of the school authorities.

Having said all these, let me make it clear that the above mentioned category of students and parents form only a small percentage. But can we ignore them ? Can we allow some more precious lives to perish because of a few miscreants?

Other than making the laws to be more teacher-friendly, I feel the need of the hour is to cultivate emotional intelligence among children which will help them to evaluate, express and control their emotions. Teach them the golden rule that any mistake can be corrected and

there is nothing wrong in taking punishment. Through punishment they become strong, determined not to repeat the mistake and feel confident to face challenges in life.

So much has changed in last two decades. Google dominates text books, the attention span has fallen from four hours to four minutes, the fear of and respect for a teacher even at a distance has given way to friendly informal dialogues and rubbing shoulders with them, the strictness has given way to a leniency that ignores mistakes.

After completing two and a half decades in this profession. I am demoralised, pressurised and perplexed; having the three options in front of me.

To be : Whether to continue as I have been till now;

Not to be : Quit this profession of an educator as I have proved a failure in the art of overlooking mistakes;

Let it be : Be indifferent to what happens around and be happy with the not-so-meagre amount that is credited to my account every month, if my conscience permits me to do so.

FAREWELL ST. PETER'S

Rev. Fr. Bhaskar, Rev. Fr. Paul Thannickal, Rev. Fr. Praveen, Rev. Sr. Daisy, Esteemed Staff Members, my family and friends and my dearest students,

For 32 years I have walked the corridors of St. Peter's. I have seen these Ashoka trees grow taller, seen the sun glinting on the St. Peter's symbol high on the roof, counted so often the 33 steps as I went up and down the Senior school staircase; I have taught thousands of students, shared their joys, sorrows, dreams and thoughts, picked them up when they fell, scolded them, appreciated them, advised them, celebrated them and most of all, loved them. Today as I leave, I stand at this podium with a deep sense of sadness and a deeper sense of peace inside me- it is like the pain of leaving home and the peace of home-coming.

Except in those myriad childhood games, I don't think I ever envisaged myself as a teacher. The pathways of my life meandered, twisted and turned in ways unforeseen and one day I found myself standing in front of a big group of students in a classroom...It was July 4th, 1986, that I embarked upon this remarkable journey in St. Peter's. Little did I know then, what an eye-opening and humbling experience it would be - that it would change my way of looking at the world. No B.Ed. class had prepared me for what an actual classroom was like. Lessons never proceeded according to plan – How could they? – 50 different attitudes, interests, levels of motivation, all crammed under one roof- - more varied than the sea, more colourful than the rainbow- - and though I was the teacher, I also became a learner from that first day in Class, and started to discover my own self.

It was Fr. Jose Maliekal who appointed me as teacher here. Fr. George Paul, who came in next as Principal, gave me the first opportunity to grow and delve within myself for skills I did not know existed. I am grateful to him and to the other Principals – Fr. Dennis, Fr. Matthew, Fr. Ferreira, and to you Father Paul - and to all the Vice Principals and Headmistresses..., thank you for making me a part of this world for the past 32 years. I am also grateful to His Grace, the Most Rev. Dr. Albert D'Souza, who in his capacity as the President of the Governing body kept me in his prayers.

Thank you my friends and colleagues in the staff who shared the daily irritations and frustrations – only they can truly understand the tension of meeting correction and syllabus completion deadlines. The staff room, where I spent so much time, was, to me, like a kaleidoscope of beautiful ever-changing vibrant colours – adding to the joy, the energy that is so much a part of St. Peter's. 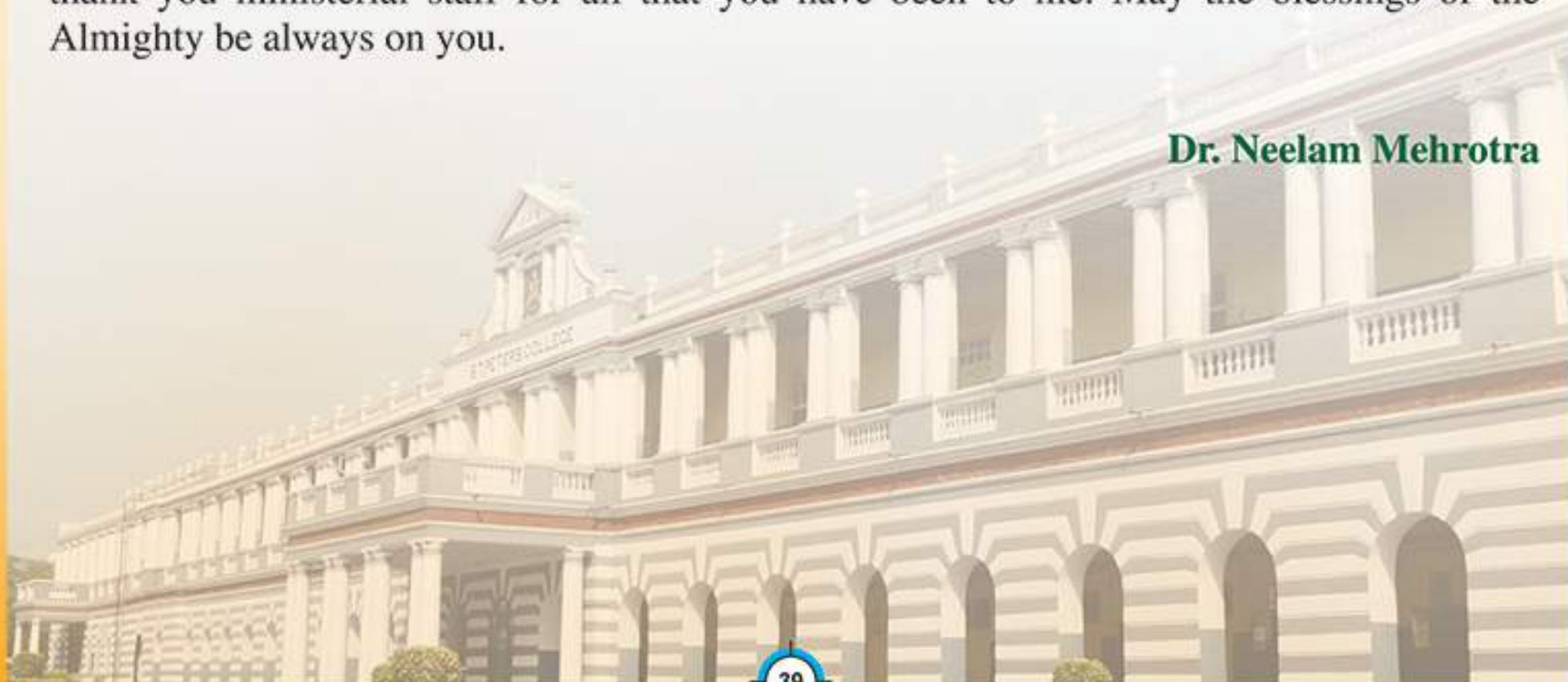

हम वहाँ बैठे उसकी प्रतीक्षा कर ही रहे थे कि व्ही एक महिला दकदकी हुई अंदर आयी और ऐसे स्वर में हमसे बोली कि अपनी कज़ में लेटा हुआ हिल्टन भी ज़ाबद हिल गया होगा, "ओह, तो अज़ है, जो चंदा देना चाहती हैं? देखिए, आप मुझे 500 किलो चावल दे दें अभी तो मुझे यही चाहिए। और कुछ नहीं। अगर आप नहीं दे सकाँ तो जाइए। बस, मैं जा रही हूँ।"

कोई शिष्टाचार नहीं, खुराी का एहसास नहीं, कोई मुस्कराहट नहीं..... वह आई और कुछ शब्दिक चमन करके चली गयी। मैंने अपने आप से कहा, "वह है चंदा लेने की प्रभारी। भगवान, इस आश्रम के बच्चों की रक्षा करना।"

मैं और मेरी वह मित्र इतना होकर कुछ देर तक तो सोत ही नहीं पाए हम इस नितांत अपमान व अनादर के कड़वे अनुभव से उबरने की कोशिश में लगे रहे। खेड़ा उठा कर मैंने अपनी मित्र से कहा—“हम इन्हें 500 किलो चावल दे ही देते हैं, हमें तो बच्चों के लिए करना है, न कि इस महिला के लिए। तो फिर बच्चों की भूख और अपनी सद्भावना की बीज हम इस महिला के दुर्व्यवहार को उड़ते क्यों जाने दें ?

जब अचानक कोई रोग जोक होने लगता है तो डाक्टर कहता है, “दवा आप पर रेस्पॉन्ड (Respond) कर रही है।” लेकिन यदि तबिकत बिगड़ने लगती है तो डाक्टर कहता है, “आपकी ऊपर दवा का रिएक्शन (Reaction) हो रहा है।

सही Response सकारात्मक होता है, Reaction नकारात्मक होता है। हम यह ध्यान रखें कि जीवन में कभी भी और किसी भी स्थिति में हम Reaction न करें, बल्कि अपने लिए एक सही और सटीक Response का चयन करें।

प्राकृतिक आपदाएँ

गौपी जी ने साफ कहा था कि प्रकृति मानव को जरूरतें पूरी कर सकती है परंतु उसका लालच नहीं। प्रकृति हमारे जीवन का अंग है जो हमें आवश्यक वस्तुओं का प्रबंध करती है जैसे कि स्मूड (नौर), पेड़ (फल), स्वच्छ वातावरण (स्वस्थ जीवन), पीछे (ऑक्सीजन एवं फल) आदि। बर्फाली स्विट्जरलैंड की पहाड़ियाँ, फूलों से भरी वात्किनियाँ सौंदर्य का उदाहरण देती हैं। हर स्थान अपनी प्राकृतिक एवं भौगोलिक खासियत के कारण पहचाना जाता है परंतु जब यह अपना भयानक रूप धारण करता है उसे प्राकृतिक आपदा कहते हैं।

इन प्राकृतिक आपदाओं को टालने में कोई समय नहीं रहता परंतु इनसे बचने के लिए हम कुछ कर सकते हैं। यह आपदा एक तूफान, आँधी, बाढ़, अकाल एवं धरती के हिलने के रूप में आ सकती है। मैं इन प्राकृतिक आपदाओं के बारे में विस्तार से बताऊँगा:

धरती का हिलना (भूकंप)—यह आपदा जब प्रकट होती है तो एक देश को बर्बाद करती है। एक अविस्मरणीय घटना है नेपाल की जब 2014 में 8000 से ज्यादा व्यक्ति अपनी जान खो चुके थे, 50 मिलियन घर बर्बाद एवं नष्ट हो गए, खाने के लिए लोग लड़पते रहे। कई जीव जानु ने अपने प्राण लुटा दिए। यह आपदा तब अती जब टेक्टोनिक प्लेट हिलती है। इस आपदा को भूकंप भी कहते हैं।

उपाय—भूकंप आते ही खुले स्थानों पर चले जाना चाहिए। यदि आप एक भवन में हैं जिससे निकल पाना कठिन है तो हमें किसी मजबूत (वस्तु) के नीचे बैठ जाना चाहिए।

बाढ़—यह प्राकृतिक आपदा किसी नदी का प्रहर पड़ने पर आती है जब पानी की ऊँचाई बढ़ जाती है और रास्ता बूझते-बूझते शहरों में प्रवेश करती है और सारा शहर नदी बन जाता है। इस समय पानी अस्वच्छ हो जाता है।

उपाय—हमें बिजली का रास्ता बंद कर देना चाहिए ताकि किसी को करंट न लगे। बाढ़ आने पर हमें अपने घर की ऊँची छत पर जाना चाहिए।

क्या आप जानते हैं किसी नदी को बिहार का शोक 'सीरो ऑफ बिहार' कहा जाता है क्योंकि यह नदी हमेशा बाढ़ का कारण बनती है।

अकाल—यह आपदा मानव को भूखा रखने का कार्य करती है। यह आपदा खेती व अन्य जगहों को सम्ये समय तक पानी न देने पर आती है। इस आपदा के कारण हम कुछ भी खाद्य पदार्थ नहीं उगा सकते।

उपाय—हमें पानी को बचा करनी चाहिए क्योंकि 'पानी ही जीवन है।'

जंगलों में आग लगना—पृथ्वी का निर्गत तापमान बढ़ने पर 'ग्लोबल वॉर्मिंग' होती है जिससे जंगलों में आग लग जाती है जिससे पशु-पक्षियों को परेशानी होती है। सब जलकर राख हो जाता है।
