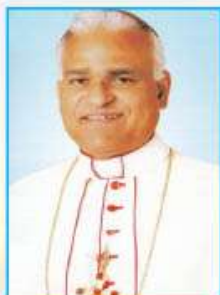

From the Principal's Desk

It is with a feeling of satisfaction and gratitude to God that I write about the academic session 2018-19 of the College. With God's grace and the co-operation of the staff, the parents and the students we were able to conduct the affairs of the College with a reasonably high degree of success. We were able to maintain high standards, enforce discipline, encourage students to greater endeavour and strike a balance between tradition and innovation.

Academics

The unit, terminal, final and Board Examinations showed the importance the College places on studies. In the ICSE 2018 Examination 275 students appeared. Of them 79 got 90%. The topper was Anush Mangal with 97.6%

In the ISC 2018 our results were no less flattering. Of the 164 students that appeared 30 got 90% Aman Jain was the topper in the science stream with 95.5% and Garvit Kumar in Commerce stream with 98% marks.

Annual Awards Day

Annual Day was celebrated on 3 May, 2018. The students staged a variety entertainment programme which won the plaudits of the audience. Mr. Ajay Anand IPS, ADG Police was the Chief

Guest. Special prizes and awards were also given away. The most coveted Archbishop's Gold medal was won by Simar Singh Gulati and the Principal's Silver medal by Praveg Vashishtha.

Staff Enrichment Programme

Going by the dictum 'Teachers are also learners', the College organized a motivational seminar for the staff conducted by Dr. P. Vishwas. The seminar and workshop helped the staff to stay updated and cater to the needs of the students.

School Parliament

April, 2018

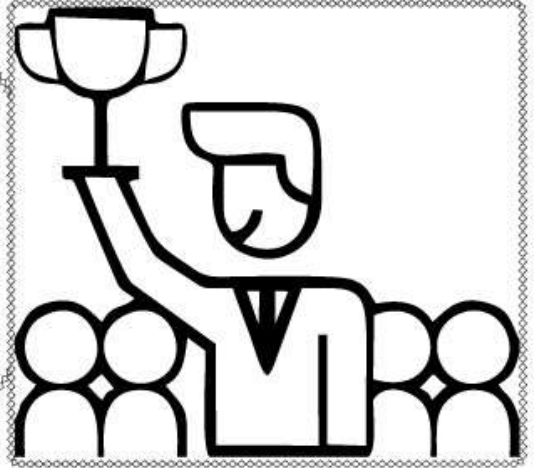

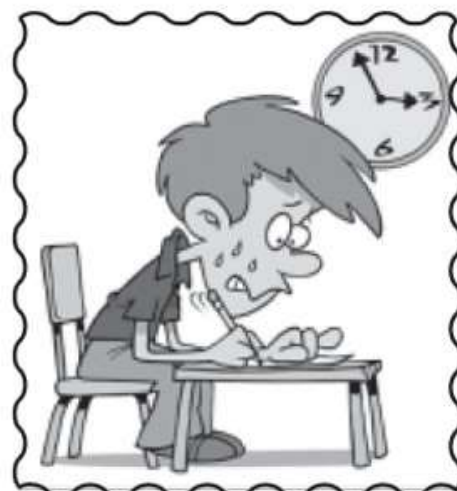

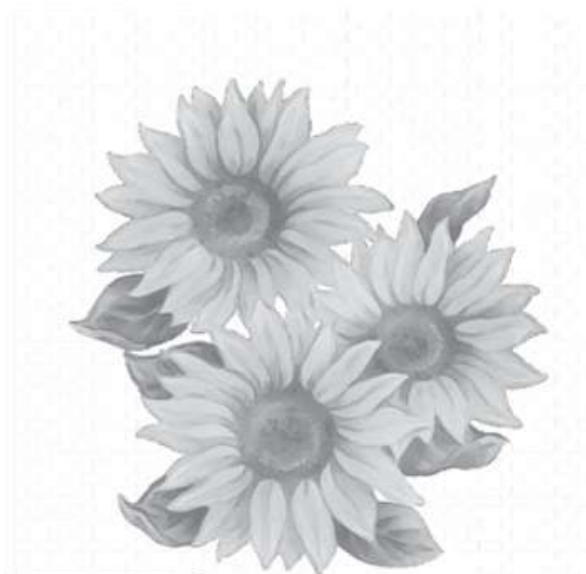

The Second Vulture

There is a famous photograph named "The Vulture and the Little Girl" which depicts a little boy, initially believed to be a girl, who was Francisil and famine stricken and a vulture eyeing him from nearby waiting for the child to die. The child was supposedly attempting to reach a nearby U.N food Centre. The photographer, Kevin Carter won the Pulitzer prize for feature photography for the year 1994 for this photograph. He was asked in an interview if he knew what had happened to the little child. He replied that he had chased away the vulture and did not know more of the fate of the child because he then boarded a plane and left the region. On hearing this, one of the audience said that there were two vultures that day and the second one had a camera in its hand!! Carter committed suicide four months later, a result of the trauma which he had faced during his journey to the famine stricken regions of Sudan. Although there are various theories and speculations that Carter was prohibited from going near the child by the soldiers who were accompanying him, he was still regarded as inhumane for leaving the child there. However, some regard him as one of the few photo journalists who drew the world's attention towards such problems. His photograph was published in the N.Y Times in March 1993.
